English

Our fictional text, based on real events is The baker's boy and the Great Fire of London. The children will study The Great Fire of London using various writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation techniques to create a diary excerpt. They will have the opportunity to write a set of instructions on how to bake bread.

Other studies this half term:

Various texts, extracts and poems to discuss how authors use a range of techniques to engage the reader and entertain.

Science

Food Chains and Healthy Eating

Children will be able to investigate the need for healthy eating and different ways of staying healthy. They will have the opportunity to explore what a food chain is and where we are in the food chain. By the end of the unit, they will be able to explain what predator and prey are.



Music

The children will listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory. They will use Charanga to investigate rhythm and pitch and sing a new song 'I wanna play in a band'.

Art and Design

Children will be using a range of materials and media to create a free-standing Tudor house from the Great Fire of London times. They will also learn about Jackson Pollock and the style of Action painting.

History - Great Fire of London

The children will study the Great Fire of London. They will understand past and present ways of living.

<u>Geography</u> – Studying the local area and London. Locational knowledge/map work. Children will learn about what London and Bradford have to offer.

Computing (computers and iPads)


