Always trouble-prone, the life of teenager Percy Jackson (Logan Lerman) gets a lot more complicated when he learns he's the son of the Greek god Poseidon. At a training ground for the children of deities, Percy learns to harness his divine powers and prepare for the adventure of a lifetime: he must prevent a feud among the Olympians from erupting into a devastating war on Earth, and rescue his mother from the clutches of Hades, god of the underworld.

Children will plan and write a quest story based on Ancient Greece and write a postcard as either a visitor to Athens or Sparta.

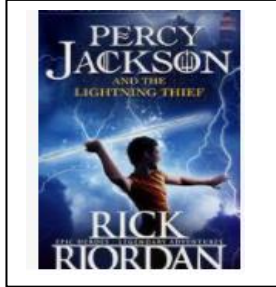

Evolution and Inheritance

Students will discover how traits are passed down from one generation to the next and how species have changed to fit in with their surroundings



History: Ancient Greek Life

The children will learn about who the ancient Greeks were. About their culture and way of life. What it was like to live in an ancient Greek family. They will study the ancient Greek gods and heroes and the beginnings of the Olympic Games

Geography: Human and Physical Geography Based on current news topics the children will describe and understand key aspects of physical geography, including: climate zones, rivers, mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes, and the water cycle. They will describe and understand key aspects of human geography, including: types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water



Maths

Number-Ratio

Understand and use ratio language. Calculate ratio and solve problems.

Number: Algebra

Understand and use algebra, describe number sequences using letters as symbols. Solve problems using algebra.

Number: Decimals

Identify the value of each digit in numbers given to three decimal places and multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 giving answers up to three decimal places.

Important Information

- Pupils are encouraged to **read at home** every night in upper KS2 and planners must be signed by parents/older siblings. This is an expectation that will help with learning.
