

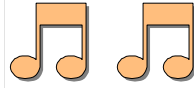
English -

History: Ancient Greek Life

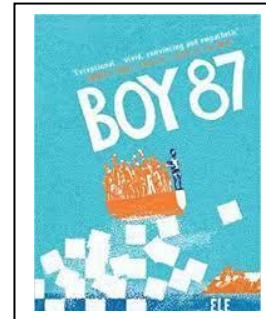
